
'Essentials of Successful Case Based Teaching' 06th to 20th September, 2021





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#### Instructions/Guidelines to be followed by the University/Institution

#### I. Disbursement of funds to University/Institutions

- a. The full amount of the grant sanctioned is being released as advance to the University/Institute.
- b. The amount spent by the institute on the conduct of FDP shall be adjusted on the basis of utilization certificate and detailed expenditure statement submitted by the University/Institution on the prescribed format along with other mandatory documents viz feedback form, copy of proceedings and completion report etc.
- c. The above said amount of grant shall be refunded back to AICTE if the Letter of Approval (LOA) / Extension of Approval (EOA) is not issued by AICTE to the institute for the academic year 2020-21.

#### II Maintenance of Accounts

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

Day 1: 6th Sept. 2021

**Session 1:** 09.00 to 11.00 AM

Resource Person: Dr. Mansi Kukreja, Associate Professor, IBMR, IPS Academy, Indore

Topic Covered: Insights on Case Based Teaching in Management

**Summary:** Ma'am started the session with discussion about the entire 2 Weeks online FDP. Case based teaching and learning process is the need of current times & we as management teachers need to differentiate ourselves & our students in terms of experiential learning. Ma'am also discussed that case based teaching & learning shall be incorporated in all the management domains, be it theory subjects or practical once. Ma'am concluded that not only the cases but along with dealing with case studies in the class, faculty members shall also motivate the students to learn from the immediate contemporary environment.

Day 1: 6th Sept. 2021

Session 2: 11.30 to 01.00 PM

Resource Person: Dr. Swati Soni, Associate Professor, Jaipuria Institute of Management, Jaipur

Topic Covered: Case Based Teaching: Moving from Traditional to Modern Teaching Pedagogy

**Summary:** Ma'am initiated the session with a quote 'Remember that we in this Modern Era of Teaching & Learning Process are not the teachers rather we are the facilitator'. To move from traditional teaching to modern teaching, the role of teacher is to make the students active during the entire class. The active participation of the students in terms of group discussions, team work, mentoring other students will break the monotony and make the learning fun. Ma'am also introduced the concept of co-creation into teaching as the external environment is dynamic and the industry expectation from 21st century students is 'think creatively & act responsibility'. We as a teacher shall impart design thinking, group dynamism, and innovative problem solving approaches to our students to make them industry ready future managers.



Day 1: 6th Sept. 2021

Session 3: 02.00 to 03.30 PM

Resource Person: Dr. Swati Soni, Associate Professor, Jaipuria Institute of Management, Jaipur

Topic Covered: Case Based Teaching: Moving from Traditional to Modern Teaching Pedagogy

Summary: Ma'am has started the session with how to discuss the cases in classroom teaching. The session is a hands-on experience where in a case titled 'Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams' is shared with the participants. A brief about the case is given to the participants and after that they were moved into the breakout rooms for the group discussion. This activity made the entire session interactive and discussion oriented. The piece of advice for the case based classroom teaching is: A good case does not have to be too long, A climate of discussion should be created in the class, Group discussion shall be motivated and Also hand holding to the students for developing the small cases from their immediate external environment.

Resource Person: Dr. Nidhi Jhawar, Associate Professor, IBMR, IPS Academy, Indore

Topic Covered: National Education Policy 2020

Summary: In this session ma'am discussed education policy, its purpose and its key features. Education is the ability to make better choices, data science, machine learning, AI. Education policy must be innovative and adaptive, creative and multidisciplinary. New Education Policy imparts Social and Ethical knowledge. The further discussion was on the Changes brought by NEP 2020, i.e. 5+3+3+4 model of learning that include foundation stage, preparatory stage, middle stage, secondary stage respectively includes UG and PG Programs. NEP 2020 gives flexibility of choosing the subject. The policy assessment is multidimensional. Major reforms of Education 4.0 are taken in NEP 2020 about graduation and PG programs. New Education Policy has given privileges to students by offering scholarships. It is basically that Higher Education follows our passion.

Day 2: 7th Sept. 2021

Session 2: 11.30 to 01.30 PM

Resource Person: Dr. Pooja S. Kushwaha, Associate Professor, Jaipuria Institute of Management, Jaipur

Topic Covered: Innovation & Foresights in Teaching

Summary: Ma'am started the session with great zeal and enthusiasm and asked the expectations of the participants out of these workshops. She discussed the need for learning, innovation in teaching, necessary ingredients for learning, strategies, etc. She emphasized the need for attention, commitment and passion towards the training approach and how a teacher/trainer can make it a unique experience for students. The students centric learning approach must incorporate: conducing environment, self reflection, research orientation, risk taking attitude, flipped classroom & most significant is understanding that the classroom is the platform of learning for all the students. She suggested that using small stories & cases in the classroom teaching will make the classroom teaching more students centric. She also emphasized on involving students in research work, this exercise will give them the experiential learning. The Entire session was full of real time examples.

Session 3: 02.00 to 03.30 PM

Resource Person: Dr. Karunesh Sexena, VC, Sangam University, Bhilwara, Rajasthan

Topic Covered: Handling Cases in Classroom Teaching

Summary: Sir has started the session with a beautiful PPT on learning & earning. He explained the entire path of handling the cases in classroom teaching. Sir has given a detailed description on executions of cases in the classroom. Sir has discussed the five stage model for effective case analysis and the stages are Framing, Labeling, Summarizing, Synthesizing & Concluding. Sir explained that key to good case analysis is to break down the case facts into a clear, understandable & useful form. The session has ended with a discussion & final tips of solving the cases in the class are provided by Karunesh Sir.

Day 3: 8th Sept. 2021

**Session 1:** 09.30 to 11.00 AM

Resource Person: Dr. Vinay Goyal, Associate Professor, S.P. Jain Institue of Management & Research, Mumbai

Topic Covered: Case Writing Techniques in Finance

**Summary:** Sir started the session explaining the process of writing a case in the finance domain. He started explaining the process with 25 essential points while writing a case. A case length shall be between 3 to 8 page and shall be delivered in 90 mi class. He showcased some of his research work and then linked the steps with the cases for the better understanding. Out of 25 steps of writing the case he explained 13 steps in this session. He also clarified the common mistakes made by researchers, which leads to rejection of case study.

Further he explained the entire check list that will provide assistance to first time case writers. In this session the difference between primary case and secondary case is very well explained & what all important points to be taken care in both the writing is explained. The lucid discussion motivated the participants to involve into the discussion with sir and sir suggested the topics on which cases can be written however, every situation is unique in some or the other way when it comes to writing a case, is the ultimate take home from the entire session.

She explained the key learning objective, what should be the focus of case, the data used to analyse the case controversies faced during case analysis, idle length of case, learning from case emotional link and engagement with the case. Further she also explained case difficulty cube. video cases, approaches used in case teaching so, that key learning objective can be achieved.

Topic Covered: Case Based Teaching Methodology Marketing

Summary: In extension to the previous session, Mam further discussed in second session how to encourage participation in case for learning, what should be the effective role of case instructor, asking the right question so, that the anatomy of case should rotate among who, what, why, when, where and how, tips considered while case teaching, role of case analyzer i.e. reading the case effectively and creating the proper meaning so, that case analyzer can go for advance discussion and give contribution for collective understanding of the case. The analysis of question and issues that are asked in case study which will help to recognize some contextual factors that result in limiting and narrowing the analysis.

Summary: The Third session started with the steps considered for analysis of cases, online case teaching pedagogy should involve clarity, engagement and accountability, how to write case analysis report and use of SCHEMES(shape, case, helpers, equipment, materials, expertise system) mnemonic to check that the comprehensiveness of plan, possible marketing models like Porter's 5 forces models, RACE planning framework, kotler's five product levels, consumer decision making process, consumer perception and cognition process at last the session ended with case analysis of The Apt App case discussion with participants.

She started explaining the linear and non linear structure of the case, content presentation of the case configuring, how case writing process replete with facts and information but they aren't shape into single truth. She also discussed case writing and the purpose of case writing as teaching vehicle for building reservoir of subject knowledge and developing analytical skills, the strategy behind developing the case so, that to fill the gap of new course , revised course and replace oldie but goody.
