

## 2.3 Industry Visit

## 2.3.1 Industry Visit to AMUL Panchamrut Dairy, Ujjain

## Date: September 12' 2023

It was resolved that a milk co-operative society would be organized in each town of Kaira Region to collect milk from the producers and federate into a locale association. Monetary assistance from Unicee helped the production line to fabricate milk powder and Butter plants. Dr. Rajendra Prasad, then-President of India, laid the foundation on January 15, 1954, and on October 31st, 1955, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, Prime Minister at that time declared it open. The plant was extended to fabricate improved condensed milk in 1950. Amul is a trial fruitful run since last long term with the goal of up liftmen of the rustic economy. Amul is a cooperative unit laid out on 14th December 1946 at Anand. The association was laid out under 'Khira District Milk Product Limited' Amul has its emblem; Amul's emblem consists of four hands joined together.

## 2.4.1 Examination Process:

## 1. The Examination Process:

- Internal Assessment/ Mid-term exam (Best 2 out of 3 internal assessments are considered each of 20 marks)
- External Assessment/ End Semester Examination (60 Marks written test)
- External Viva-Voce (Comprehensive Viva Voce 100 Marks, IT Viva Voce 20 Marks & Analytics Viva Voce 20 Marks)

## 2. Question paper:

- The subject faculty of respective classes prepare the question papers of internal exams.
- The end semester examination question papers are prepared by the panel of paper setter.
- Further the papers are moderated before considering for the final examination.

## 3. Viva Voce:

- Panel of examiners are appointed to conduct the Viva Voce: Comprehensive, IT & Analytics (If Applicable)
- The students are divided into panels for the smooth conduction of Viva-Voce.

## 4. The Evaluation Process:

- Internal assessment is done by the respective faculty members teaching in the class.
- End semester examination evaluation is conducted daily after completion of the end semester exam paper.
- End-semester examination answer sheets are coded and then issued to subject expert faculty members for checking.
- Once the end-semester examination answer sheets are checked, they are sent to the head evaluation centre for cross-checking.
- Internal & End semester examination assessment marks are punched on ERP of IPS Academy.

## 5. The Result Process:

- After completion of the evaluation process the provisional result is declared on the student's ERP.
- Any student query related to results is collected in the form of an application, which is further monitored and corrective measures are taken by the evaluation committee.
- After the completion of the entire process the final result is declared on student ERP.
- The hard copy of the summary sheet of results & mark sheet are further checked by the checker & duly signed result is forwarded to the university for approval.
- The university-approved marksheets are distributed to the students.

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





# 3.2.2 MRP and Research Project Allotment and Completion




